I have been busy this year attending shoots with lots of ups and downs. I am now shooting in the Master Senior class and wanted to raise the bar in the State Indoor for Long Bow Wooden class and Recurve Off The Shelf class. I practiced for almost 2 months messed around with arrows to get the right combo. I also worked real hard on form. I was almost to my goal on my backyard range averaging in both classes scores 320-340 on the 450 round. My target was to break 450. I came up short in both classes I had a melt down with the longbow wood scoring 277 I just could not find my sight picture. For the Recurve class at least I was able to hit close to my average and scored 332. Both scores took first place in the class

this year but short of records. I am going to get there next year. The most fun shoot so far was the State Traditional Championship hosted by Fresno Field Archers. Their range is in Dunlap just off Hwy 180 East of Fresno. It's a two day shoot, the first day is 40 targets 2 arrows un-marked 3D's. Day two the top five scores from day one are paired up for the Championship. I was in second by 6 points going in on day two. Being the new guy to the class and had the honor of shooting the first arrow and I choked shot over the target. I recovered made up the difference and overtook the leader then dropped back, then got even but in the end wound up in second place after the back and fourth on the 20 targets and finished even with him for the day. It was a blast with 4 guys I had never met before let alone shot with. It was a great weekend camping with friends and making new friends. Thankfully the weather was beautiful all weekend and we are all thankful that it held off until the following weekend otherwise we would have been in the snow. Oh, it also was record attendance this year over 200 shooters registered. Enough about me I would encourage each and every one of you club members to at least attend and participate in the local clubs shoots. They come and support us and we should support them. All of our clubs and the CHBH count on the entry fees to fund our clubs. It does not matter what your skill level is if you enjoy shooting your bow you should explore shooting on different ranges. There are three shoots on the next three weekends all within 100 miles for Modesto. Horseshoe Bend just up Hwy 132 from us at Lake McClure is holding their Buffalo Shoot Sunday March 12, Madera Field Archers is holding their Bounty Hunt Sunday March 19, and Lodi Bowmen is holding the Cartoon Classic March 26,. Each of these clubs had shooters at our Spring Fling. I am going to attend all three and I hope we will have representation at these shoots as well.
